Our Chairman's Valedictory Report


The Group has had another successful year, and in spite of reduced active members, your Committee has worked hard to expand our aims and activities. A summary of the year's activity is given below:

AWARENESS

This is ongoing, and we have played our part in attending a number of events across the county, (including two in the Forum in Norwich, and seven major charity fundraising events), supported by regular poster distribution and press reports. Along with other Eastern Region Support Groups, we have repeated our call to Health Authorities for an early introduction of a wider Prostate Cancer Awareness and Screening programme, which still falls on deaf ears. It is a matter which we will continue to pursue, given the recent publicity from the Government on the success of the Breast and Cervical Cancer screening programmes, and the announcement this week by the Secretary of State for Health of a massive screening programme for coronary disease, diabetes, kidney disease - but not for Prostate Cancer - costing £250m per year. diagnostic tests announced during the past year should bring a reliable screening programme closer, if a sense of urgency and funding is applied. Patient pressure from all PCa Support Groups will be needed to make this happen, and a new Prostate Cancer Federation is being formed in London this month to give a louder voice from patients and their carers.

INFORMATION

Our information leaflet has been reprinted again to meet demand, and some 3,000 copies of our bi-monthly Newsletter were distributed during the Our six open meetings at the Norfolk & Norwich and James Paget Hospitals continue to be popular, with total attendance over the year of some 900 people. To meet ongoing demand from new patients we are repeating some of our earlier talks by invited consultants on all aspects of the disease. Our membership list of patients and carers has grown to over 300, and our website has now received over 3,250 enquiries, (an increase of 1,400 on last year). Our website is to be further developed in the coming year. A large selection of information booklets is available from our Display Stand, together with DVDs and hardback books on loan.

SUPPORT

We continue to offer telephone support from committee members, but were not able to develop the buddy scheme we had envisaged due to lack of active volunteers. However, our new Welfare Officer will be looking at how we can set up a local contact network across the county from people who have offered to be a source of information, encouragement and help. We have donated wheelchairs to the Norfolk Red Cross, and worked with them to supply patients in urgent need who were experiencing delays from the NHS. We have been instrumental in raising the £50,000 support costs for the Cryo-Ablation treatment trial at the Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital, which is now well under way with some encouraging results. Some eight men with recurring Prostate Cancer have been treated to date giving improvements to their quality of life, and the prospect of holding the disease in check for lengthening periods.

We will continue to monitor this project with a view to repeating our call to NHS Norfolk (formerly the Norfolk Primary Care Trust), to introduce this treatment on a successful completion of the trial. Those in need of practical help or advice (other than medical), are urged to contact us, when we will continue to do our best to respond. Medical concerns can be referred to one of our Specialist Urology Nurses for advice. On the Social side, we organised two events, a midsummer river cruise, and a Christmas lunch, both of which were well supported and enjoyed by those who came along, and we plan to have similar events this year.

Thanks to the diligence of our Treasurer, Stan Thompson, our financial affairs are in good order, and we remain in a strong position at the year's end. We thank all those organisations and private individuals who have so generously made donations during the year, particularly those who have sent the proceeds of funeral collections in memory of their husbands or fathers, to whom we have sent our sympathy and thanks.

Finally, I would like to extend my personal thanks to all members of the Committee, our nurses, speakers, and volunteer tea ladies, who have given much of their time and experience in supporting the Group during the year, and offer my best wishes to those who are retiring from the Committee this year. My own term of office ends at the AGM, although I shall remain as a Trustee of the Charity, and hope to continue to give my support to the Group in other ways. We now have a strong local Support Group to offer help, voice our concerns, and give greater visibility to this disease, where much more can and should be done to reduce its effects. I extend my very best wishes for its continuing success. Thank you.
